Now I've found a home in the
Episcopal Church.

I was **Confirmed**
(I made an adult
affirmation of
my faith)

I was **Confirmed** because my parents
made me, peer pressure, or just because time
I stopped going to church for a
long time.
Now I want to **recommit to my faith**.

You are a
Christian Episcopalian

You can be
Received
into this
Communion
making you a
Christian Episcopalian!

the **Bishop**
you can **Reaffirm**
your **Baptismal
VOWS!**
